MESSAGE FROM THE EXALTED RULER



Someone reminded me a few days ago that, for the first time in the last four years, I would be having a birthday on the 29th day of February. That reminder caused me to look into the mirror and wonder where all the time has gone.

Some of you may not be aware of the fact that the average age of our mem-

bers is now approaching 73 years, or the fact that the number of our members has consistently declined during nine of the past ten years.

We are not alone. As members of the Elks, Rotary, Lions, Freemasons, Knights Templar, Eagles, and Moose age and pass on, those who survive them are challenged with the uphill battle of recruiting newer and younger members to replace them. Many of these organizations, including our own, have not fared particularly well in meeting that challenge. For instance, the Freemasons lost nearly 3.8 million members between their peak in the late 1950s and the beginning of the decade which just ended. Since 1980, Elks membership has itself dropped from 1.64 million to roughly half that number. And the membership of our own Lodge will, by the end of this fiscal year, be roughly half of what it was only ten years ago.

Why is that so?

There are many explanations for that phenomenon. To name just a few of them:

- Many millennials would never dream of joining a club that seems primarily geared toward the needs of their grandparents.
- Ask any member of the millennial generation most of whom are accustomed to fraternizing on Facebook, Twitter or by using some other form of social networking – what the Masons, the Eagles or the Knights Templar might be, and he will most likely think that you are referring to the latest pop band. That's just one of the problems facing local fraternal organizations whose very existence is being threatened by irrelevance in a modern world.

- Many millennials who do know who we are would nonetheless ever dream of joining a club that seems primarily geared toward the needs of their grandparents
- In brief, younger members want interactive community service opportunities in addition to the other benefits of membership. They don't simply want to just write a check
- A lot of people join but don't really volunteer time or really participate in what's going on. They are members in name only, and pass by the wayside when it is time to renew their memberships because we have been unable to maintain their interest in who we are and what we do.

What can be done do turn the tide?

- To begin with, any service organization which thinks 'We've always done it this way" is a good reason to continue to doing the same in the future, is fooling itself. The needs of those young professionals whom we hope to attract to our Lodge are very much different today than they were a generation ago.
- Groups that are more successful at getting member participation in and attendance their events are those groups where members are doing something constructive, such participating in community betterment projects, while socializing at the same time. For whatever it's worth, each of the four new members whom we initiated in January spoke exactly to that point.
- Many groups which been able to reverse the trend under which membership losses seem almost preordained have group moved away from featuring speakers who discuss topics that are relevant only to retirees, shortened their meetings, eliminated attendance requirements and simplified their rituals.

We need to do a better job of keep those whom we recruit active in what we do.

Many, if not most, of you who will read this message have been members of the Elks for many more years than I have had that privilege, but I suspect only a few of you, if any, will remember when the construction of our current facility was concluded nearly fifty years ago. It's never too late, however, to consider the possibility that we may have to start doing things a little differently than we did 50 years ago in order to grow our membership and keep our members involved in doing good things for the community. The organizations that can master the art of accomplishing both of those objectives are the ones that will survive.
