Soldiers Angels

Soldiers' Angels is a non-profit organization that provides



food for veterans whose income is 85% or more below the national poverty level. Once a month about 30 volunteers meet at the Lodge and bag food for aver 200 veterans. The work requires lots of hands because the food is delivered in bulk by the Second Hand Harvest Food Bank and we

have to break it down to manageable portions.

The volunteers have to break down hundreds of pounds of vegetables and put them in smaller bags. They also have to break down cases of donated food and put them in over 400 shopping bags for the veterans and their families. After all the food is organized and stacked they then direct a conga line of cars through the Lodge parking lot to pick up the food at several stops.

We could use a lot more help as it is a people intensive operation. If you are interested, watch for the next distribution date and show up at 8:30 and sign up. We are usually done by 1:30 but you do not have to stay the whole time. Once the food is sorted, we can operate with a smaller staff and just have a couple of volunteers at each station.

Each veteran leaves with several bags of vegetables, a couple bags of meat and two bags of groceries, totaling about 50 pounds.

The last time we did this we had 30 volunteers but only two were Elks. Two PERs to be exact. Of the 30 volunteers half were veterans helping other veterans. This is the type of program the ENVSC really likes and I encourage more Elks to become involved one day a month. You will go home dirty and sweaty but feeling pretty good about yourself and what you helped accomplish.
