Hi to everyone!

Autumn is in the air. Can Christmas be far away? This year we will be collecting toys for both Toys for Tots and Samaritan's purse. Please be generous and contribute to at least one of these organizations to brighten the Christmas season of a needy child.

As I write this column, Soldiers' Angels is still on hold for their transfer from Lake Baldwin VA to our Lodge parking lot for the third Friday of each month – stay tuned!

Our portico repair is taking more time than we would like. It was rumored to contain asbestos, and consequently we felt it necessary to have it tested for that substance. The tests came back positive at 15% in the underside (ceiling), so the removal of said material will be done by certified professionals before any reconstruction. We are gathering bids and will be having architectural drawings done, because we plan to make a height adjustment to prevent future "situations". At this point there is no predictable time for completion, but it would make a nice Christmas present!

We continue to gather estimates for other building improvements, such as the repaving of our parking lot, new flooring, new digital signage, and the replacement of air conditioning units.

We appear to be getting a little closer to having our own full time caterer on premises. William E Anderson works for George Ashford of CateringsBest, the company that has been providing our Friday night dinners. George Ashford understands that we need someone on site and is agreeable for the Elks to bring Chef William on as our in-house caterer. Our current interim Treasurer, John Baum, is helping William with all the necessary paperwork to begin this endeavor. Many of you have already met William, as he has mingled with our members on several of our past Friday nights. Perhaps we will be able to have Thanksgiving and Easter buffets again. He would like to expand on our current food service schedule.

Our Lodge will be applying for another 3 day open liquor permit for the weekend of Saturday, October 20<sup>th</sup> through Monday, October 22<sup>nd</sup>. Our new member, Susan Buttery, who owns the Juice Bar on South Street, is planning an event for Sunday, October 21<sup>st</sup> which will be open to the public. Her former Thornton Park restaurant – The Crooked

Bayou – will be "popping up" in our 1079 kitchen that evening for 2 seatings to serve the most popular items off their former menu. This "Pop-Up" kitchen night will be a cash only evening, as she expects hundreds of former customers to pass through our doors that night between the hours of 5 pm and 10 pm. Notice that we will also be able to serve alcohol at our regular Monday Public Bingo night. That Saturday will also have a Burgers and More team, so it should be a pretty good weekend.

Following that busy weekend we will have our Drug Awareness Night on Tuesday October 23<sup>rd</sup>. Please plan to attend as we want a good turn out to honor those children with the best essays against the use of drugs and alcohol. Dinner will be served at 6 pm, followed by the winners reading their essays and receiving their awards.

The BOD has decided that in the event that two customers request events on the same evening, the Elks pub may be rented to the public. This has been done before, but not very often. Since we are in need of additional cash flow this year, it will be done more frequently if the need arises. We will also rent the Lodge room for classes and meetings only – no food or beverage there other than water. We have a good centralized location and we now have several weekends where we have 3 events happening on the same day. It can be a lot to keep track of, but one must make hay while the sun shines!
