Message from your acting Exalted Ruler.

I am writing this message as acting Exalted Ruler following the resignation of our elected Exalted Ruler, William Smith and our Esteemed Leading Knight, William Woolgar. I only hope that I can do justice to this position of honor during the transition to fill those positions. The elections should be completed by the second lodge meeting in August.



First of all, I want to express the lodge's appreciation for the efforts of William Smith while he was ER. Some on the board didn't always agree with Bill, but he was tireless in trying to do what he thought best for the lodge. He was instrumental in getting the lodge kitchen facilities cleaned. He obtained reliable janitorial services that now keep the lodge and its bathrooms in notably cleaner and fresher conditions. It was also his efforts that brought us to the threshold of obtaining a caterer for the lodge. His "thinking outside of the box" led us to contract negotiations that sought to provide a monthly kitchen rental income instead of a percent of sales. He also did much to clean out several areas of clutter in the lodge. Bill deserves credit and thanks for his efforts. I truly hope that he continues to be an active member in the lodge.

I should also add that his wife, Jocelyn took over the maintenance of our website during Bill's reign and she continues to do this work for the lodge. Thank you, Jocelyn.

Our lodge is suffering from a lack of active members which in turn causes few charity fund raising and community involvement, and veteran and member appreciation events. I try to put my finger on the cause of this lack of involvement. Of course we have many "older" members, but it's more than that that's causing this situation. When my wife, Donna and I travel to other areas in Florida on mini vacation trips we always try to visit the local Elks lodge to see how they are doing and to take advantage of reduced prices for food and entertainment. We have seen several lodges that are doing very well and are packed with members. What are they doing that we are not

doing? Well, for one, they have kitchens that offer good food at reasonable prices on a regular schedule. Some staff their kitchens with volunteers and others use employee chefs. Thanks to Bill's efforts we are on our way to doing the same. These lodges also use people that have a requirement to do community service. That's an area we should look into.



This is an amazing feat that happens on a monthly basis at the lodge for pre-approved Veterans in need of assistance. The semi truck of food arrives at 8:30 and all food is sorted into about 6 distribution points. Frozen meats, canned goods, fruits and vegetables, breads, cake and cookies, you name it, it gets handed out. A long line of cars roll thru the parking lot starting at 11 and usually by 1:00 all food has been distributed. A very heart warming day for the volunteers. Consider helping out this month. Attention Members: Proposed Improvements

The board of directors and members of our lodge met last month to seek a positive vote to repave the parking lot. The meeting met with objections in that the members did not understand our reasoning to spend money on the outside parking lot and not address the other interior needs of the lodge.

This article will hopefully clarify the reasons behind our hard working Boards request to vote favorably for the funding.

Your Board had appointed a parking lot review committee last year to examine the condition of the blacktop after years of complaints from members about the potholes and uneven surfaces, and so after discussions the committee concluded that we would be negligent to ignore the dangers of tripping and other foreseeable injuries. That made repaving it our highest Lodge priority in the vote we sought to gain last month.

Also, last year the Florida Elks management convened at our lodge to discuss our declining membership and the future of 1079 and with that fact as background they also mentioned similar declining membership issues facing other lodges. It's no longer a secret that because of financial strains on the smaller lodges the Elks organization will have to consolidate the smaller lodges and transfer membership to the more prominent lodges. We were encouraged by them to have our lodge infrastructure assessed by an independent professional real estate expert to predict it's relative life expectancy. I suspect something good or bad is about to happen in our district and directly involves 1079.

Anyway, the recommended assessment was completed and it suggested other than minor repairs that one major upgrade was needed, namely to resurface the parking lot.

The board committee solicited three bids from paving contractors and after interviewing and examining credentials, the low bidder was chosen. His price currently stands for the complete job at \$70,000.00.

The carpeted flooring has been long overdue to be replaced with a laminate. The board voted to spend approximately \$43,000.00 to remove the carpet in the pub, entrance hall and ballroom.

We will include both of these two projects together in our petition to the Grand Lodge to enable the scout money to enhance and improve our infrastructure.

Use it or lose it. Spend money to make money.

Let us vote favorably to fund these infrastructure upgrades.
